Dear brothers in Christ,

As Catholic men, we are called to a life of loving service responding to the Love & Mercy God has shown to us. We are called to care for our families, to attend to the poor and to defend those in our care especially the weakest among us. By these actions we bring to life a realization of God's Kingdom and a New Evangelization as we serve our faith communities for it is through the witness of the lives of believers that a renewal of the Church and our world is possible. I am delighted to share with you that a great and wonderful opportunity exists for Catholic men to answer this call to serve by becoming a member of the Knights of Columbus.

This exemplary Order of Catholic men was founded in 1882 by the Venerable Servant of God Fr. Michael J. Today, the Knights of Columbus are 1.9 million members strong in 17 Countries, and provide an example of faith lived publicly and for others. While the Knights combined efforts are impressive it is the impact at the local and family level which is most impressive.

However, there is much work which needs to done in the name of charity.
