
Time does fly and death will find us. May we lead lives of profound faith, so that eternal life will be our destiny and our joy.

As you know, the Knights of Columbus is a Catholic, family, fraternal, service organization. This theme permeates our program areas of Church, Community, Council, Family, Culture of Life, and Youth. In fact, the Knights of Columbus provide meaningful and relevant programs of action that help leave a positive impact to the community in which you live. Here are some program highlights since July 2014 and valuable information as we Go Make A Difference!

Church

The Iowa Knights of Columbus **donated over \$125,000 to vocations** in the 2013-2014 fraternal year. The funds include donations directly to the Bishops, donations from Councils

directly to seminarians and postulants, and donations for vocations-related events including statewide gatherings of new priests, seminarians, and those discerning the priesthood.

Membership Report-First Four Months of 2014

Iowa Knights of Columbus Charitable Foundation



Brothers All:

The "Helping Hands Fund" helps improve the quality of life for many Iowa Knights of Columbus and/or their families. Support from you, our brother Knights, makes this possible.

At the 2004 Iowa State Convention, a resolution was passed establishing the Iowa Knights of Columbus Charitable Foundation. The primary arm of the Foundation is the Helping Hands Fund. In keeping with the First Degree of our Order, "Charity", the Helping Hands Fund is used to supply grants directly to individuals who suffer an unexpected personal hardship.

The Fund has supported many different needs: persons with debilitating medical conditions, persons that have suffered personal losses due to fire, flood or storm and persons whose children are suffering from cancer and other severe medical conditions.

Requests for assistance have steadily increased over the years. In fact, to date this fiscal year, we have received double the requests from last year. Unfortunately the money coming in to the Fund is not keeping up with the money we feel we need to give out. If we are not able to increase the amount of support coming in to the Fund, we will be forced to greatly reduce the amount of assistance being given.

We need the support of every member, every Council and every Assembly to help us continue the efforts of the Helping Hands Fund. We ask you to reflect upon the important work of this Fund, and financially support our mission of "Charity" in serving those less fortunate.

The Foundation is asking that each Council/Assembly add the Helping Hands Fund to their annual budget. Your annual commitment to this Fund allows us to better serve those in need. Every Council/Assembly should hold an annual fund raising event with proceeds set aside for donation to the Fund. Or, is it asking too much that each Council/Assembly annually donate \$1.00 per member?
