"Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities" reaches new high

As of February 20th the CPID drive has reached a record all time high with \$664,995.38 collected by 192 councils in Iowa. The previous record set last year was \$633,578.92 and with several more councils needing to complete their report, we are on track to make one of the biggest yearly increases since the program began in 1974.

Our overall results since the CPID drive started has reached \$17,971,545.77 and we have provided Special Olympics Iowa with nearly a million dollars in state donations from the state's 10% of the funds collected by our councils.

STATE DEPUTY'S REPORT

Brothers.

I want to bring you up to date with the Culture of Life Committee activities. The committee is chaired by Brother Knight Bob Sinclair of Williamsburg. Other members include PSD Mike Gaspers, DD 48 Steve Heffern, Knights for Life Director Jim Bates, Joe Henkels and Steve Cashman. Non Knight members include Jenny Condon the Director of InnerVisions HealthCare and Maggie DeWitte the Executive Director of Iowans for Life. The goal of this committee is to structure our statewide activities in support of our ongoing individual efforts to protect the sanctity of life from conception to natural death. The most critical goal is to cut the abortion rate in Iowa in half over the next five years. This will be accomplished with a marketing strategy, coordinating with local councils to assist prolife pregnancy centers and the installation and implementation of ultrasound machines in more clinics.

Recently the committee has reached out to the pregnancy resource centers and medical pregnancy centers informing them of our existence and desire to help. We believe Knights can organize a training conference for the directors of these clinics that would be provided free of charge for these non-profit entities. We believe providing a forum for sharing best practices and connecting with each other and Knights will accelerate progress toward our goals. We are wanting to conduct the event this summer and need your help to get this accomplished. The estimated cost of this event is \$50,000. We need your donations.

At the state convention last year I asked the delegates to go back to their councils and start raising funds for the committee to accomplish our goals. The request was for \$52 per member over the five year period. Why \$52? That is the average cost to save a baby when we pool our resources. You can imagine your \$52 saving a baby's life. Imagine how that would make you feel. Please Brothers, follow the example of Clay Gubbels and the Carroll Council and start raising funds for this committee. With Clay's guidance, the council raised \$10,500 for the committee. There are other examples but not every council is yet engaged.

How do you send your donations to the committee? We have established a fund in the Iowa Knights of Columbus Foundation. This means donations can now be tax deductible since the foundation is a 501c(3) charitable organization. Send your checks to: Tom Wittrock, Treasurer Iowa KofC Charitable Foundation at 770 310th St., Bagley, IA 80026-8014. Make sure you put in the memo of the check that it is for the Culture of Life Fund.

You can also go online to Seethebaby.org to make your donation. You can use your credit card to make your personal tax deductible donation. There is a link at the top of the Iowa Knight of Columbus webpage that will take you directly to the site. Share this link and the Knights for Life goal with your family and friends.

There is a map below showing you where the prolife clinics are in Iowa. You should notice there are areas without any centers. We believe Knights can help to change that map. If you are in one of those areas without a center and have the desire to ask "Why Not have one here?," please contact myself or any of the committee members. We would be glad to discuss the possibility with you.

If you are next to an existing center – they need our help. Make certain your council has a Hero for Life acting as a liaison between

the council and the center so that your council may become a better partner in saving lives by providing basic help like upkeep and day to day operations.

Thank you Brothers for all you do to promote a culture of life in a society floundering in a culture of death.

Dear Brothers:

I hope that a few weeks ago you participated in Mass on Ash Wednesday, during which you received Blessed Ash on your forehead as a sign of repentance. In my parish after blessing the ashes I invite Catholics and non-Catholic believers to come forward to received the blessed ash. I add that children should come forward also if they are old enough to understand the difference between right and wrong; that is, if they are old enough to engage in repentance.

The ash is a sign of our repentance. Were the ashes a valid and potent sign on your forehead, or were the ashes something that was void and empty?

Lent should make a difference in our lives. Lent is like the pebble that we find in our shoes or sandals, which absolutely demands that we stop and remove it, because it is too awkward or painful to continue to move with it. Lent should not just make a difference in our lives, but Lent should also make a difference in the lives of others? Is this happening? Is our observance of Lent making life better, easier, or happier for others?

We heard about temptations made to Jesus on the first Sunday of Lent. The last sentence of that gospel reminds us that the devil left Jesus "for a time." Yes, temptation does come to us again and again. And like Jesus after fasting for 40 days—we know that when we are hungry, weak, tired, or vulnerable—fighting sin and temptation becomes more difficult.

Dear Brothers, as Knights we are to be a shining light in the world, to be a man of dedicated faith which shines through the dark places and moments of our life. We are to be—recalling the wonderful play written about Saint Thomas More—a man for all seasons. Vivat Jesus!

"REMEMBERING OUR FALLEN" Traveling Photo Memorial of Iowa Fallen on Display



"We must remember these American Heroes and speak their names when we see their family members. We can never forget those who sacrificed everything for our freedom," said Bill Williams, co-creator of the memorial. "While this memorial is about those who have died, it was created for the living...to help the families in their grief, while reminding the rest of us of the terrible price paid for our freedom by our current generation of military."

A very emotional memorial, "Remembering Our Fallen," is a stark reminder of the ultimate sacrifice made by 128 Fallen from Iowa killed in The War on Terror while wearing our country's uniform in a war zone. The photo memorial, which includes military and personal photos of each of Iowa's Fallen, is traveling throughout the state and will be coming to Des Moines on April 15-17, 2016, as part of the 2016 State Convention of the Iowa Knights of Columbus, being held at the Des Moines Marriott Downtown. The exhibit is financially sponsored by Iowa District of the Fr. Padilla Province of the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus.

In a joint statement, Iowa Knights of Columbus State Deputy Jon Aldrich and District Master David Bellendier remarks, "The Iowa Knights of Columbus are honored to serve host for this moving tribute to those who have given the ultimate sacrifice in service to our beloved country. This exhibit is but only a small token of our appreciation, admiration, and respect."

The exhibit will be on display at the Des Moines Marriott Downtown around the clock during the three-day convention, April 15-17, 2016. Cost for admission is free. There will be an opening ceremony on Friday, April 15th at 9:30 AM with remarks from Knights of Columbus leadership, various military organizations representatives, and elected officials.

This memorial and 17 other state memorials representing half of our country's Fallen since 9/11/01 have been created by Patriotic Productions, a non-profit organization headquartered in Omaha, Nebraska. 

Randy Schuh from Des Moines Council 11643 at St. Mary of Nazareth with the assistance of brother Knights, spent two weekends distributing crosses after the Masses. The wooden crosses, made from pruned branches of olive trees, were handmade by Christian artisans living in the Holy Land.

Randy obtained 100 crosses that were quickly acquired by parishioners in return for a donation. Amount collected was \$3,780.00 and \$500.00 was given to the Christian artisans for making the crosses. The remainder of the proceeds went to the persecuted Christians in the Middle East. The idea for receiving donations for crosses came from last year's Knights of Columbus Supreme Convention.


