

My very dear brothers-

Before anything, I want to wish you and your families a wonderful and happy 2019. May all the days on your calendar come full of God's blessings.

The year 2018 was not an easy one in many aspects of our lives: politics, government, media, Church. But we are fortunate to look at a new set of days in which history is yet to be written. The new calendar gives us the hope that things may be different and better. As we look at those empty blocks on the wall, we can only wonder what God has in store for us and how **We Are Called** to continue building His Kingdom on Earth.

Despite everything going around us, we need to continue being the <u>Strong Right Arm of the Church</u>. We need to find new ways in which to continue the missions <u>We Are Called</u> to fulfill. Our Church is facing challenges all over, including the lack on interest and devotion from our younger generations. A Pew Center poll shows 65% of those leaving the Catholic Church, do so between the ages of 10 and 23. As we are in the second half of the Fraternal Year, I want to encourage you to double your efforts in growing the Order and creating a stronger foundation of Catholic men and families for our beloved Catholic Church. Christ has already won the victory, He has defeated death and won for us eternal life. Let us bring that message to all through our charitable works, our Christian values, and our conviction as the exceptional men that our Church and society need. Elections, Trainings, and Awards dominate Convention

The State Convention of the Iowa Knights of Columbus is a three-day experience where Knights and their families from throughout the state gather at one site for meetings, spiritual development, fellowship and training. During the day, meetings, seminars, exemplifications and other activities take place. There are activities for all Knights, their wives/ significant others and kids so all are welcome. Banquets are held on Friday and Saturday evenings where awards and recognitions are presented. Masses are held each day.

Anyone and everyone can attend so go to the lowa KC website http://iowakofc.org/convention to register, purchase tickets and find more information. Each council is permitted two delegates to represent their council at convention and they receive per diem at \$50 per day for two days and round trip mileage at \$0.15 per mile from the lowa State Council. It is highly recommended that the coun-

cils also support their delegates by providing similar funding to offset their costs to attend the convention.

The rooms at the Downtown Des Moines Marriott cost \$99.00 per day. Make your reservations online by going to http://iowakofc.org/convention.

The convention ladies committee has set up a great line up for the weekend, including the ladies luncheon with featured speakers Marilyn Lane and Ellen Miller, the co-founders of the Christ Our Life Catholic regional conference.

This innovative and necessary addition to the Hospital grounds will provide veterans receiving care there a safe environment to enjoy the outdoors while gaining confidence in traversing various terrains like those they will encounter when returning home.

I am inviting all Knights, Councils and Assemblies to become informed about this project and consider making a funding donation toward its completion. Your State Council Executive Committee has already committed a \$2,000 donation. Mark and Bob have agreed that Knights could pool donations and sponsor one large facet of the garden and in so doing receive a recognition plague to be forever memorialized on the grounds.
